# Why donate to Resource Depot?

When you choose to donate at Resource Depot you are choosing to be part of the solution! Thanks to our growing REuse Community, Resource Depot keeps thousands of pounds of reusable materials out of the landfill each year. Additionally, items donated to Resource Depot provide low-cost arts and education supplies to our community.

## What kind of items do you take?

Ideally, we are looking for items that have creative reuse value. We accept a wide range of materials, such as fabric, yarn, paper, art supplies, office supplies, wood scraps, classroom supplies and more. Things we are looking for reflect the items that artists, educators and youth most frequently want and need to make art, crafts and learning experiences affordable and possible.

## How do I donate?

On average, Resource Depot receives nearly 10,000+ pounds of reusable items each month. Each donation we receive must be weighed, inspected, sorted, and processed before it is made available to customers. As a small non-profit with limited staff members, donations appointments help manage the flow of materials we bring in and allow us the time needed to maintain operations and reduce employee burnout.

Large, and/or unsorted donations (2+ boxes to a trunk-full) take extensive time to process before they can be made available to shoppers and therefore require an appointment.

Small, pre-sorted donations (1-2 boxes/bags) are far less time-consuming for our staff to process and therefore, can be dropped off anytime during our business hours.

When arriving for your appointment, simply pull up to the loading dock, ring the doorbell, and a member of our donation staff will assist you in unloading your items. For small, unscheduled donations, we kindly ask that you park on the street and walk your donation in.

## Do you offer a pick up service?

While we do not provide a regular pick up service, we have recently partnered with ReSupply, a veteran-owned and operated organization, that is working to revolutionize charitable giving by offering at-home donation pick-ups and can often pick-up your items within 48-72 hours. To ensure the best use of your donations, we kindly ask that you clean and sort your items before donating them.

## What happens to my donations after I drop them off?

Your donations are vital to our mission of promoting creativity and sustainability. After you donate, our team carefully sorts and organizes the items. Some materials are directly used in our workshops and outreach, while others are made available for purchase in our shop at affordable prices. By donating to us, you help keep valuable resources out of landfills and make them accessible to the community.

## Can I receive a tax receipt for my donations?

Yes! We are a registered nonprofit organization, and we can provide tax receipts for your donations upon request. Please note that it is your responsibility to determine the value of the donated items for tax purposes.

## Can I donate money instead of physical items?

Absolutely! Monetary donations are greatly appreciated and help us cover operating costs, expand our programs, and reach more people. 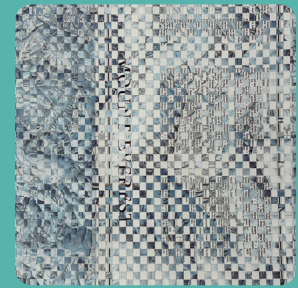
